

## Lockdales' Auction #217 Report: The Fine Sale 8-9 June 2022

Total prices realised: £351,615 (incl. prem.)

A strong two-day sale, with a good turnout in the room in addition to hectic online, telephone and commission bidding.

Jewellery was strong as ever, with prices up to £6500 for a diamond set lattice brooch. Then the silver was notably popular, with multiple sleeper lots including Irish and Dutch silver going for up to £2300 for an 18thC Dublin saffron pot.

On Day 2 the wristwatches section contained multiple Rolexes, realising prices in excess of £10K for some. A good vintage Explorer 1965 went for £9000 hammer. The Pictures section had some absolute star items including Discovery Expedition watercolours by Dr E.A. Wilson, lots 831 and 832, which hammered down at £7200 and £6200. Wonderful historic pieces. A damaged oil on canvas of the Duke of Wellington by Robert Hillingford managed to reach £5000. Later stoneware sculptures by John Maltby proved to be highly sought-after, all exceeding expectations.
