## Lockdales' Auction #293 Report: Coins & Militaria: 13-14 May 2025

Total prices realised: £333,666 (incl. premium)

A strong and well-attended two-day sale. 95% success rate for coins, and many highlights in the militaria. Gold sets were sold up to £6000 for the 1989, and early Sovereigns are pushing book values. A couple of Gothic Crowns in GVF and aEF were sold for £1900 and £2300 hammer. Maundy is performing very well. In the World section an American Colonial elephant piece in EF+ made £1500. The Ancient & Hammered section was very interesting, with the Ancient Greek coins selling in their entirety. A large Bulk Coins offering was well-received and bidding was fierce. In Exonumia a group of Norwich local interest brewery medals, including one in 9ct gold, made £1050.

The second day was dedicated to militaria, starting with Weapons. We saw various four-figure results for German daggers, up to £2500 for an Eickhorn with marked hanger. Highlights in the Medals included £3600 for the Army of India with Poona clasp; £1600 for the Sjt. Booth 'shot at dawn witness' group; £1600 for the L.Cpl. Clench DCM & trio; as well as £4800 and £4600 for Soviet Orders. The rare and impressive Imperial German Aviator's Goblet of Honour reached £6400.

Our next sale of Coins & Militaria is scheduled for 15-16 July, but will likely be a three-day sale 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> July owing to the quantity of coins already consigned.
